Join cultural educators from the Tamarack Hollow Nature and Cultural Center in a dynamic, handson participatory class focusing on folkloric and contemporary West African & Caribbean drumming, percussion and singing. Students will learn hand and instrument technique, an understanding of how drum patterns fit together, cultural context of the music, fun and challenging drum patterns and exercises and accompanying songs in many languages. 
