DID I HEAR YOU SAY: "I DON"T KNOW **IF I HAVE HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE?"**



The only way to know (diagnose) if you have high blood pressure (HBP or hypertension) is to have your

blood pressure tested. Understanding your blood pressure numbers is key to controlling high blood pressure.

Systolic blood pressure (the upper number) — indicates how much pressure your blood is exerting against your artery walls when the heart beats.

Diastolic blood pressure (the lower number) — indicates how much pressure your blood is exerting against your artery walls while the heart is resting between beats.

These two measurements help your doctor to determine if you do have any abnormality with your blood pressure. And we do have you covered. Come to our blood pressure clinic, held on the 4th Wednesday every month, and you will be able to track your measurements and report them to your physician.

This month's clinic will be held on Wednesday, July 25th 10:30am!
