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

- •No proof of eligibility required
- •Please park in the old Waverly Parking lot on the grass, volunteers will be there to direct you

Circuit Breaker

Senior Citizen Property Tax Relief

The Circuit Breaker is designed to give income eligible senior citizens a credit of up to \$1,080 on their property taxes.

You may qualify if You:

- Are age 65 or older by December 31, 2017
- Own or rent in Massachusetts as principal
- Residence

Your total income does not exceed:

Single filer: \$57,000
Married filing jointly: \$86,000
Head of household: \$72,000

Who is Ineligible?

- Those who receive federal or state rent subsidy
- Those who are a dependent of another tax payer
- Those whose property is assessed at a value of more than \$747,000

How Much is the Credit?

As of January 1, 2017—capped at \$1,080

This tax credit is applied to what is owed for income tax. If the credit is more than what is owed, a refund (interest free) will be issued.

Ask your Tax Preparer if you qualify!

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


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Theresa Marby
