Textile collection available at your Towns Transfer/Recycling center



As of November 1, 2022, Textiles are a new item <u>310 CMR 19.000</u>; <u>MassDEP waste ban</u>. Textile's no longer can be disposed in your household trash. Textile recycling bins are located In the following locations (See below) for all member towns to utilize. In 2021, 77,154 pounds of textiles were diverted from the Waste stream. 
