The town of Savoy will hold a **Special Town Election** on August 17th from 12 noon to 7pm. This election will be held to fill the remaining term of the vacancy on the Select Board. The term of this position will expire in 2023 at the next Annual Town Election. Nomination papers for this position may be picked up at the Town Hall starting June 14th and must be returned by July 12th. The Town Hall public hours are Tuesday, 1-5 pm, Thursday 9-1 pm, and Friday 9-1 pm.
