Memorial Building Update:

We've been getting a lot of questions on when we think the COA will be moving over to our new space in the Adams Memorial Building. This is a very fluid process and we are unsure of the timeline. There is currently no set date for the transition, as work still needs to be done in order to make this a successful move and be able to adequately serve all our program participants. Our hope is to be able to move in by the end of spring/beginning of summer, but that depends on a lot of factors, some of which are out of our control. One of the major items that needs to be completed is the kitchen/café area. A new double bay sink needs to be purchased and be installed by a professional plumber, new cabinets need to be purchased and installed by a trade professional, and new furnishings need to be purchased and arranged. Many of these items take weeks to months for the orders to arrive, and then the professionals needed to install them have very full schedules. The Town and COA are also working on a way to get additional men's and women's bathrooms funded and installed to meet the needs of program participants. This may not be possible to accomplish before the move, but it is a goal, and an important one. These bathrooms are needed to help meet the health and wellness needs of all our program participants, most of whom are residents of Adams, Cheshire, and Savoy. We anticipant increased attendance once we make the move to the Memorial Building, as we will have much more space to accommodate additional consumers. The Town of Adams and the COA are hoping to fund this project through private grants, Town funds, the COA budget, and ear-marked funds from the Friends of the Adams COA. But, we will need a lot of support from the community, especially as the Town is considering if and when it will be able to open up the building for community uses other than COA programs, such as sports leagues and private functions. If you are able, please consider donating to the Friends of the Adams COA, designating your donation to the Memorial Building needs. Every little bit helps to make this successful and have an amazing community gathering space in a nostalgic Adams location!

Nutrition Program Suggested Donation Increase:

As of March 1st, suggested donations for Elder Services meals served at the Adams COA Monday-Friday will increase to \$3. For more than 20 years, Elder Services' voluntary donation has been \$2 per meal. It now costs them \$9.50 for each meal they serve and they made the decision to increase the suggested donation in order to help off-set costs associated with greater raw food costs and minimum wage increases. The donation will remain VOLUNTARY. If a senior is UNABLE or CHOOSES NOT TO make a donation, they will still receive a meal, with no judgement or questions.
