- D. In partnership with Hospice Care of the Berkshires a new support group, Living After Loss, will be offered at the ACOA. The support group will meet every month on the 2nd Wednesday at 2 pm. Preregistration is not necessary, but welcome.
- E. Rainbow Seniors of Berkshire County, working in partnership with the ACOA and the Adams Free Library, will sponsor a showing of the Gen Silent documentary followed by a group discussion on Wednesday, Sept. 27 at 12:30 pm at the ACOA.
- F. With the retirement of John Naughton, the ACOA welcomes two new van drivers, David Ronnow and Greg Trottier.
- G. Digital Literacy/Equity and Hybrid Programming grants were secured to purchase, promote training, and provide equipment for 10 COAs, including the ACOA.

H. EOEA FY24 State Formula Grant increased from \$12 to \$14 per town resident aged 60 and older. ACOA will receive a flat fee for the inclusion of the Savoy town residents aged 60 and older in programming.

Pam St. John reported early results for its major fundraiser, which included musical BINGO, raffles, and a silent auction, were successful. A formal fundraising report will be provided at the next meeting.

The ACOA Friends are currently reviewing venues and liability insurance options for its afternoon teaparty.

Item 1: ACOA and diversity

ACOA is committed to ensuring diversity, equity, and inclusion and will work to promote its services for all populations. ACOA is expanding its partnerships with the Rainbow Seniors of Berkshire County. Item 2: Alzheimer Training Options

The Alzheimer's Association provides free, training that features content to understand dementia and create safe, respectful, and welcoming options for interacting with people living with dementia. Training options recommended included; Dementia Friendly Training, Purple Table, and First Responder Training.
