

The Adams Fire District Annual Election will be held at the Fire Station on Tuesday, May 14th from 12:00 Noon until 6:00 p.m., the annual meeting will follow at 7pm. Absentee ballot applications are available upon request.

HAVE YOU EVER VOTED FOR THE FIRE DISTRICT ELECTION? If you answered no, your not alone. Of the some-odd 3,500 house-hold who can vote only roughly 100 show up to vote. The election this year addresses some serious questions that could greatly increase your water bills through your fire protection.

If you're someone who lives within the Fire district boundaries and are a registered voter then keep an eye out for a mailing that will explain the ballet questions and voting procedure.

Voting this year will include ballot questions asking the community if the water bills should increase to accommodate a paid full time fire Chief and a full time fire fighter. After the polls close, the votes will be counted and the answers to the water district questions will be reviewed. Should the community support this request made by current Fire Chief than the following years budget (fiscal year 2021) will include salaries for both or one of the positions, depending on this elections outcome. The results will be available at the Annual Meeting which begin at 7:00 p.m. The public is invited to attend this meeting.





Anna Jarvis' campaign to make Mother's Day a recognized holiday in the United States began in 1905, the year her mother, Ann Reeves Jarvis, died. Ann Jarvis had been a peace activist who cared for wounded soldiers on both sides of the American Civil War, and created Mother's Day Work Clubs to address public health issues. Anna Jarvis wanted to honor her mother by continuing the work she started and to set aside a day to honor all mothers because she believed a mother is "the person who has done more for you than anyone in the world".

In 1908, the U.S. Congress rejected a proposal to make Mother's Day an official holiday, joking that they would also have to proclaim a "Mother-inlaw's Day". However, owing to the efforts of Anna Jarvis, by 1911 all U.S. states observed the holiday, with some of them officially recognizing Mother's Day as a local holiday. In 1914, Woodrow Wilson signed a proclamation designating Mother's Day, held on the second Sunday in May, as a national holiday to honor mothers.
