Potential Changes on the horizon for the Adams Fire District

The Adams Fire District, separate municipal entity from the Town of Adams, operates on its own budget from the fees collected on District bills. However, not every house in Adams is in the District, so the budget is only supported by a portion of homeowners within the Town. With their budget, it strives to provide the best possible service, while keeping the rates at an acceptable level.

Every year, the District holds an Annual Meeting & Election at the beginning of May where District customers vote on the budget for the next fiscal year. If you pay a water bill, YOU HAVE A VOTE. There are some potential changes on the horizon and over the next few months we're hoping to be able to help educate you on the voting process, structure and budget requests. Stay tuned.

A representative will be here on **Feb 15th** to distribute flyers and answer your questions.



Are you concerned with everyday activities like reading newspapers, recipes, and labels; not being able to drive; or being safe in the kitchen?

Circuit Breaker Tax Credit

The Circuit Breaker is designed to give income eligible senior citizens a credit of up to \$1,100 on their property taxes.

Who is eligible?

- Massachusetts resident or part-time resident
- Must be 65 yrs old or older by Dec 31, 2018
- Must file a MA personal income tax return
- Own or rent residential property in MA, and occupy it as your primary residence
- For tax year 2018, your total income does not exceed the following:
 - Single filer: \$58,000
 - Head of household: \$73,000
 - Married filing jointly: \$88,000
- If you are a homeowner, your MA property tax payments, together with half of your water and sewer expense, must exceed 10% of your total MA income for the tax year
- If you are a renter, 25% of your annual MA rent must exceed 10% of your total MA income for the tax year

Who is Ineligible?

- Non-resident
- You are married and your status is married filing separately
- Those who receive federal or state rent subsidy
- Those who are a dependent of another tax payer
- Those whose property is assessed at a value of more than \$778,000

The tax credit is applied to what is owed for income tax. If the credit is more than what is owed, a refund (interest free) will be issued.

Ask your Tax Preparer if you qualify!
